The conversation will focus on the topic of **Digital Subscriptions** and **Click-to-Cancel** rules. The discussion will take place via Zoom on **Wednesday, January 15 at 8:00 Pacific Standard Time / 17:00 Central European Time.**

Subscription models and auto-renewal contracts have become popular across a wide range of industries. At the same time, the subscription economy is increasingly becoming the focus of regulatory activities on both sides of the Atlantic. Against this background we will discuss recent regulatory initiatives including the FTC's [Click-to-Cancel](#) rule, California's new [Click-to-Cancel](#) law, the [UK Digital Markets, Competition and Consumers Act 2024](#), and the [EU Digital Fairness Fitness Check](#).
